# Toorak Burnside Bowling Club Rules for the Club Championship 2022-2023 

# Condition of entry: <br> All entry fees to be paid by the closing date for nominations, as specified on the entry sheet of each event. <br> Revised 6 Aug 2022 

## 1. Club Championship Committee

The board will appoint a Championship Committee to administer the Club Championships

## 2. Club Championship Manager

The Committee will appoint a Manager to run the Club Championships

## 3. Timetable

The committee will prepare a timetable for every event containing the completion dates for each round.

### 3.1 Completion Dates

Matches must be completed on or before the Completion Date for that round.

### 3.2 Dates to be advised

The Committee may leave some dates to be advised later.

### 3.3 Designated Days

The Committee may decide that all the matches of a round of an event will be played on a Designated Day. Refer to the entry forms for details
Players may appeal to the Committee to play on an earlier day provided that they can show a reasonable cause.

### 3.4 Change of Schedule

The Committee may change the Completion Dates for each round, if necessary.

## 4. Allocation of Rinks

### 4.1 Designated Days

Rinks for play on designated days will be allocated by the Committee.

### 4.2 Other Matches

Players intending to play a match must to be put their names on the outside notice board at least 3 days prior to intended date of play. To assist the Greenkeeper, no play to commence before 10.00am on any day or after 5.00pm on Sunday. Greens are closed on Monday.
Rinks for matches to be played on or before a given completion date will be allocated by the Greenkeeper.

## 5. Inability to play

### 5.1 By the Completion Date

A player who is unable to play by the completion date for the round will forfeit the match unless extenuating circumstances exist.

### 5.2 On a Designated Day

A player who is unable to play on the designated day will forfeit the match unless extenuating circumstances exist.

## 6. Appeals

### 6.1 Appeals against Forfeit

A Player may appeal to the Committee against a forfeit on the grounds of Extenuating Circumstances
The Committee may waive the forfeit provided that Extenuating Circumstances exist and that an alternative arrangement can be made to play the match.

The decision of the Committee on an appeal is final.

## 7. Extenuating Circumstances

The committee may consider circumstances which are unavoidable and beyond the control of the player to be extenuating.

## 8. Match eligibility

### 8.1 Full members

Full members are able to put their name down for all matches if they choose to do so. Consider your capacity to play all your matches by the due dates as decided by the committee

### 8.2 Social members/ night owl bowlers

Night owl bowlers are able to put their name down for the following matches: open singles (100 up), 2-bowl singles, minor singles and veteran singles

### 8.3 Substitutes in Pairs Matches

A pair may play with one substitute player with the permission of the Committee
A substitute cannot already be nominated in another pair.

## Match Format

### 8.4 Veterans Singles

Eligibility: must be 70 years old or over at the closing date of nominations
18 shots in Rounds and Semi Finals
21 in Finals

### 8.5 Handicap Singles

21 shots in Rounds and Semi Finals with at least one player starting on zero 25 in Finals

Example: If player $A$ is on -10 and player $B$ is on -7 , then player $A$ commences on -3 and player B commences on 0

### 8.6 Open 2 Bowl Singles

21 shots in Rounds and Semi Finals 25 in Finals

### 8.7 Minor Singles

## Eligibility

Have not won a champion event previously
Have not played 3 or more games in the top team, Wednesday or Saturday, in the previous season

21 shots in Rounds and Semi Finals
25 in Finals

### 8.8 Men's Singles, Women's Singles

21 shots in Rounds
25 in Semi Finals and Finals

### 8.9 Men's, Women's and mixed Pairs

12 ends in Rounds
15 ends Semi Finals and Finals
All pairs matches are played in a 2-2-2-2 format.

### 8.10 Open Singles (100 Up)

The format will be 100 points - the first player to reach 100 points is the winner.
On each end four (4) points are awarded to the closest bowl, three (3) points for the next closest, then two (2) points and one (1) point for the next two bowls, respectively.

If the scores are tied at 100 points then extra ends are played to decide the winner.
Once the kitty is rolled, it must be centralised \& placed on a washer. If during play the kitty is moved, it must be returned to its original position on the washer. If this prevented by the presence of a bowl on the washer, the kitty must be placed close and directly in front of the said bowl but not touching it!

## 9. Practice

No practice allowed on day of event as this may provide an unfair advantage to some entrants

## 10. Criteria for Handicapping

(-12) Open Singles Champion
(-12) Men's and Women's Singles Champion
(-12) Last year winner of Handicap Singles if in first team
(-11) SKIPPER in first team
(-10) THIRD in first team
(-8) LEAD and SECOND in first team
(-8) SKIPPER in second team
(-6) THIRD in second team
(-6) Last year's winner of an event if not in the first team
(-4) LEAD and SECOND in second team
(-4) SKIPPER in third team
(-2) All other pennant players
(0 scratch) New bowlers (first season)

## 11. Dress

Club Uniform in Finals
Mufti in Minor Rounds and Semi-Finals

## 12. Cancellation of Matches

When the forecast temperature at 7.30 am on the day of play is 38 C , (women 36 C ) matches will be cancelled.

## 13. Seeding - Men's and Women's Singles

Last year's winner on top
Last year's runner up on bottom

## 14. Markers for singles

The person whose name appears on the top of the draw MUST arrange a marker
